In recent weeks we have made adjustments to our administrative processes to become more efficient and transparent, and we have put hiring a kids' ministries coordinator on hold until we are able to narrow our deficit. Still, taking all of this into account, we are spending more than we are giving. Given the rapid changes in our world and in the church universal this is perhaps not surprising, but it also assuredly is not what Christ dreams for us and expects from us.

I recently attended a funeral for a woman who was one of the most hospitable people I've ever met. In her eulogy her daughter said that her legacy was not so much what she did in her life, but how she made other people feel. That has really stuck with me and caused me to think about how do I want to make other people feel? I came up with four words: valued, safe, seen, and loved. How do you want to make other people feel? What are your words?

It also caused me to think more broadly about Holy Trinity UMC. How do we want to make people feel when they enter our doors, whether they come here regularly or as a visitor? Do they feel valued? Do they feel safe? Do they feel seen? Do they feel loved? As a reconciling congregation, this absolutely should be our goal. To reach that goal we need to be intentional about how we welcome people with our signage, with our hospitality, and with our love. We are entering the final quarter of the year entitled A Place at the Table – a place where ALL are welcome – no exceptions! Mark your calendars now for our third annual One Table Event, which will take place on Sunday, December 21 immediately after church. Start planning now on what you plan to bring to share part of your history with others.

One of my favorite songs of all time is *For Everyone Born a Place at the Table* by Shirley Erena Murray. The lyrics cover everything from people needing clean water and bread to shelter, space, and a safe place for growing. Added to this are women and men, young and old, just and unjust, gay and straight. The final verse stresses that all should be able to live without fear and with the right to be free. The repeated refrain is "and God will delight when we are creators of justice and joy. Yes, God will delight when we are creators of justice, justice and joy!"

As we move through October, November, and December, we will celebrate the unending table of love, forgiveness, and grace. We will focus on immigrants, including our own immigrant experiences. We will remember that ALL are welcome at the table – the LGBTQ community, the neurodiverse community, the BIPOC community, people who are suffering from domestic violence, people who are suffering from bullying, and anyone else who needs to feel valued, safe, seen, and loved. Remember, Inclusion Starts With I.



As of 9/23/25, 428 pounds of produce have been donated to the CAP agency food shelf.



October Mission of the Month



Emma Norton's mission is to provide transformational housing for women and families on their journey of recovery. As a housing first and harm reduction organization, they believe that housing provides the foundation every human being needs in order to make progress on life goals. Using The Sanctuary Model, they take a trauma-informed, whole-culture approach to providing advocacy and supportive services that help hundreds of individuals and families who have experienced homelessness—along with mental, chemical, and/or chronic health issues—reach their goals, restore their dignity and heal from the inside out.

In 2023, they served 313 individuals, with 50 percent identifying as BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, People of Color) and all very low income. Overall: 61% of all clients maintained housing for one year or more and 87% of all clients completed one or more goals on their stability plans.
